TREE GUIDELINES

TREES

- All trees must be artificial pines and supplied by you, the participant.
- All trees must be a minimum of 5 ft. tall. With decorations, the display may not exceed 10 ft. tall and 5 ft. wide.

DECORATIONS

- You must provide all decorations for your tree or display; a tree skirt or tablecloth is required.
- Decorating with live plants, food or flammables of any kind is prohibited, including but not limited to: berries, popcorn, dried fruit, candles, aerosol snow or tinsel.
- All decorations must be securely fastened with floral wire, pipe cleaners, etc.

LIGHTS

- All trees must have lights.
- No flood lights allowed. Lights must be continuous burning no blinking or chase lights on the tree or toppers.
- Please test your lights to ensure they work. You will be notified and asked to add a new string of lights to replace those that burn out. We suggest using only newly purchased lights to avoid early burnouts.
- All lights and decorations must comply with current fire codes. Please look for UL Approval Code on packaging.

MISCELLANEOUS

- The museum is not responsible for lost or stolen decorations or display pieces.
- You are free to express your creativity and originality, but we ask that your tree represent your business, organization or family.
- The museum retains the right to remove any ornament or tree that can be considered offensive or inappropriate to visitors. Please remember, this event will attract people of all ages and should embody the holiday spirit.

THE APPLETON WILL PROVIDE:

- Electrical hookups.
- Foot switch for turning tree or display lights on and off.
- Signage for your display.
- Social media posts highlighting your organization or business.

PARTICIPANTS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR:

- The delivery and set up of tree and all decor on Monday, October 28, 2024.
- Step stool or ladder to use while decorating and any tools required to securely fasten all decorations to the tree.
- Removal of the tree and all decorations on Monday, January 13, 2025.

Tree Removal: Monday, January 13, 2025, 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. All participants must dismantle and remove their display within this timeframe.
